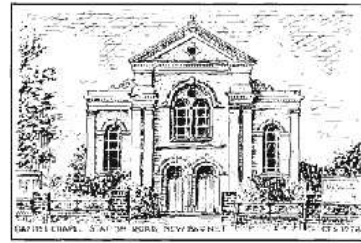

The Chapels Society seeks to foster public interest in the architectural and historical importance of all places of worship that might loosely be described as Nonconformist. These primarily comprise the buildings of Christian bodies (Protestant, Roman Catholic and Orthodox) outside the Established Church but also includes those of other faiths. We take an interest in Nonconformist churches, chapels and meeting houses throughout the United Kingdom.

We seek to promote the survival of Nonconformist places of worship, their buildings and furnishings, by offering advice and encouragement to those responsible for their upkeep. The Society is not able to make financial contributions toward restoration costs, but can advise about possible sources of grant aid.

We welcome into membership all those who are in agreement with the objects of the Society. Members receive a copy of the Newsletter, which is issued three times a year, and other occasional publications, and are invited to take part in our annual programme of visits and events.

The Society usually arranges three visits for its members and guests each year. The visits take us to various parts of the UK to explore present and former places of worship, of a wide range of denominations. Each visit is organised by someone who knows the locality well, and coach transport is provided when appropriate. The visits provide an ideal opportunity to meet other members and each usually ends with a chapel tea. The programme of visits is arranged by our Hon Visits Secretary. We also organise other occasional events such as conferences, some in conjunction with other organisations.
